2 Corinthians 5:15 (NIV) And he [Christ] died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

"Christ died that we might live for Him does not mean that we might help Him. ...What Christ died for is not that we might help Him, but that we might see and savor Him as infinitely valuable. He died to wean us from poisonous pleasures that enthrall us with the pleasures of His beauty. In this way we are loved, and He is honored. These are not competing aims. They are one."
