Dear Open Door Family,

Well, Black Friday and Cyber Monday have both come and gone. These are days when in our culture we can take advantage of special deals and sales. I must admit the crowds on black Friday never encourage my participation - but sometimes in the interest of good stewardship and stretching every penny I will go and buy something that we actually need on that day. My shopping list is never very long, normally limited to one or two items. Now when I was a young child I remember that the list of stuff that I wanted for Christmas was a pretty long list. It seldom included things like sweaters or clothes. Yet when Christmas came I always got clothing (which I needed) and seldom got those things which my sinful and selfish little heart wanted. So, I would come away from Christmas with a sense of disappointment. Looking back on it now I wish that I had been able to verbalize some of that disappointment so that someone could have encouraged me to understand that I was missing the whole point of Christmas. Christmas is a reminder of what we have already received - God's amazing Grace and Favor. We deserved judgment, wrath, and hell and God chose to offer forgiveness through the sacrifice of His son Jesus came to make a relationship with God possible. So, rather than being instead. disappointed in Christmas I needed to learn that I was focusing on myself and the gifts that I was getting or wanted rather than being thankful for God's Amazing Gift of His Son. The best response to God's GIFT is what Paul challenged the Corinthians to do.

2 Corinthians 9:15 (JBP) Thank God, then, for HIS INDESCRIBABLE generosity to you!

Romans 8:32 (NIV) He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all - how will he not also, along with him, GRACIOUSLY GIVE us all things?

Every gift I have ever given or received is NOTHING compared to this amazing GIFT from God. To give us this astounding Gift of Forgiveness and Salvation - God CRUSHED His own Son. Jesus willingly went through the incarnation - death - and resurrection for us. What an Indescribable Gift.

Psalms 37:4 (NIV) DELIGHT yourself IN THE LORD and he will give you the desires of your heart.

How should we respond to God's Gift? This verse holds that answer; however, this verse has been badly misused by Christians who use it as a formula for getting what they want from God. A little like a child trying to manipulate his parents into getting what they want for Christmas. But, if I am truly Delighting in the Lord Jesus, then I will realize that my heart is only full of joy when I truly see HIM as the answer to ALL of my DESIRES. I need to continue to learn that IF my delight is truly in knowing, loving, and honoring the Lord Jesus then I will get ALL I desire...which will be more of HIM.

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, thank you for Your indescribable Love - Love that took you from your throne in heaven to a stable, and eventually to a cross for ME. Thank YOU! Please Lord, help me to Delight in You. Help me to see You as my Greatest Treasure.
