Hebrews 2:1 (NASU) ... we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it.

The writer to the Hebrews tells us *we MUST pay much closer attention*. In other words we should never take for granted God's Word, or God's Forgiveness. We need to focus each day on God's Word and what He is saying to us.

J. Piper "One mark of Christian authenticity is discontentment with anything less that 'all the fullness of God'. Coasting is not discipleship. Drifting in self-contentment is not like basking in the pool of security, but like floating, fast asleep, towards the falls. ...There is a holy discontentment. It is not a nail-biting uncertainty about our standing with God. It is the increased appetite of those who have tasted and seen that the Lord is good. Father, we fear our deadly fondness for floating towards the falls when we ought to be swimming against the current. Oh, God, have mercy to waken us again and again, to the perils of drifting in the Christian life." (pg. 233)
