But rather than focus on that, I started to think about God and the amazing fact that God never has to wonder about what is coming or what might happen. Nothing ever catches Him by surprise. When God created Adam and Eve He already knew exactly what this would cost Him. He knew as He blew the breath of life into Adam that at just the right time He would have to send Jesus to live and to die to pay for our sins. That is one reason I love the Christmas story. It is a reminder that God is Always in Control of all things.

Luke 2:1-7 (NLT) At that time the Roman emperor, Augustus, decreed that a census should be taken throughout the Roman Empire. ...[3] All returned to their own ancestral towns to register for this census. [4] And because Joseph was a descendant of King David, he had to go to Bethlehem in Judea, David's ancient home. He traveled there from the village of Nazareth in Galilee. [5] He took with him Mary, his fiancée, who was now obviously pregnant. [6] And while they were there, the time came for her baby to be born. [7] She gave birth to her first child, a son. She wrapped him snugly in strips of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no lodging available for them.

The Roman emperor issued a decree - it did not catch God by surprise. As a matter of fact I believe it was God who moved the emperor to tax the whole Roman empire - so that Jesus would be born in Bethlehem just like it had been prophesied centuries before. Sometimes we think that maybe having Jesus be born in a stable was not part of God's plan. That having Jesus come and be rejected and crucified must have come about when things went wrong after the fall. But the fact is, the time that Jesus came was perfect, the place and way that He came was exactly what God planned. We have an Awe inspiring God who is so far above us that we cannot comprehend all the variables that He controlled in the birth, life, and death of Jesus. But we can be thankful for the fact that our God is in control and we can trust Him with our lives because of that.
