Matthew 6:21 (NIV) For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Matthew 6:21 (MSG) The place where your treasure is, is the place you will most want to be...

Matthew 6:24 (NIV) "No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money.

**Matthew 6:24** (JBP) No one can be loyal to two masters. He is bound to hate one and love the other, or support one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and the power of money at the same time.

Where is my Treasure? Is Jesus my treasure? Is serving and honoring Him my highest priority? Or is pursuing my own interests and ambitions my number one goal? What is it that I value? Do I place the highest value on knowing, loving and serving God - or something other than that? If I value earthly ease and wealth than I will do whatever it takes to receive or achieve that. I love the vivid contrast presented in these verses. How can I put God and Money - Jesus and stuff on an equal level for comparison? One way of finding out what we truly value is to look at how use the time, resources, and abilities which God has given to us.

Jesus contrasted heavenly values with earthly values when he explained that our first loyalty should be to those things that do not fade, cannot be stolen or used up, and never wear out. We should not be fascinated with our possessions, lest they possess us. Jesus calls for us to live contentedly with whatever we have because we have chosen what is eternal and lasting.
