**Psalms 37:3-7** Trust in the LORD and do good; dwell in the land and enjoy safe pasture. [4] Delight yourself in the LORD and he will give you the desires of your heart. [5] Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him and he will do this: ...[7] Be still before the LORD and wait patiently for him; do not fret when men succeed in their ways, when they carry out their wicked schemes. (NIV)

\*\*\*\*When I turn scripture passages into prayers many times I make the verses personal as well as turn them into statements of purpose. I will <u>trust</u> in the Lord and do good...
