It is no secret that there are awful things happening in many places of our world today. You cannot watch or listen to the news these days without hearing about violence and upheaval in some country of the world. Sometimes it is clear across the world many times zones away. Romans 12:21 (HCS) Do not be conquered by evil, but conquer evil with good.

Romans 12:21 (JBP) Don't allow yourself to be overpowered with evil. Take the offensive - overpower evil by good!

Luke 6:27-28 (HCS) "But I say to you who listen: Love your enemies, do what is good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you.

Susan Roland shared the following about these verses: "Sometimes we fool ourselves by thinking people will know we are Christians and will want to know more about Jesus just because we are nice. (And we're not even always nice!) But, there are a lot of nice people that don't know Christ. As Francis Chan puts it, 'There has to be more to our faith than friendliness, politeness, and even kindness.' *If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them...* Luke 6:32-36 The thing that really bewilders the world is when we love our enemies. 'True faith is loving a person after he has hurt you. True love makes you stand out.' Who are the people you avoid or who avoid you? Who are the people who have hurt you or your friends or your kids? Are you willing to love them today? They will know you are a Christian by your love!"

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, I admit that I do not always love those with whom I have disagreements and struggles. Please Lord, may I have Your heart for them. May I seek to honor You in the way that I pray for them and show Your Love for them. Lord, I cannot do this Alone, please help me!
