From DARKNESS to LIGHT ~ John 9:1-41

→ Scripture Reading Jeremiah 18:1-6

Born BLIND for God's GLORY ~ John 9:1-12

¹ As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. ² His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, **who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"** ³ "**NEITHER** this man **NOR** his parents **SINNED**," said Jesus, "but this happened **so that** the work of God might be displayed in his life. ⁴ As long as it is day, we must do the work of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. ⁵ While I am in the world, I AM the light of the world."

⁶ Having said this, **He spit on the ground**, made some **mud** with the saliva, and put it on the man's eyes. ⁷ "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam" (this word means Sent). So the man went and washed, and came home seeing.

⁸ His **neighbors** and those who had **formerly seen him begging** asked, "Isn't this the same man who used to sit and beg?" ⁹ Some claimed that he was. Others said, "No, he only looks like him." But **he himself insisted**, "**I am the man**."

¹⁰ "How then were your eyes opened?" they demanded. ¹¹ He replied, "The man they call Jesus **made some mud** and **put it on my eyes**. He told me **to go to Siloam** and wash. So I went and washed, and then **I COULD SEE**." ¹² "Where is this man?" they asked him. "I don't know," he said.

IMPLICATIONS

Romans 5:2–5 (NIV)² ...And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only so, but we also <u>rejoice in our</u> <u>sufferings</u>, because we know that SUFFERING produces <u>perseverance</u>; ⁴ PERSEVERANCE, <u>character</u>; and CHARACTER, <u>hope</u>. ⁵ And **hope does not disappoint us**, because **God has poured out his love** into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us. ⁶ You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly.

Paul tells us to Rejoice in our Suffering...

- it produces PERSEVERANCE
- > it produces CHARACTER
- it produces HOPE

Trying to DISHONOR Jesus ~ John 9:13-23

➔ The Pharisees Question The Blind Man

¹³ They brought to the Pharisees the man who had been blind. ¹⁴ Now **the day on which Jesus had made the mud** and opened the man's eyes **was a Sabbath**. ¹⁵ Therefore the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. "**He put mud on my eyes**," the man replied, "**and I washed, and now I see**." ¹⁶ Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath." But others asked, "How can a sinner do such miraculous signs?" So they were divided. ¹⁷ Finally they turned again to the blind man, "What have you to say about him? It was your eyes he opened." The man replied, "**He is a prophet**."

→ The Pharisees Question the Parents of the Blind Man

¹⁸ **The Jews still did not believe that he had been blind** and had received his sight until they sent for the man's parents. ¹⁹ "Is this your son?" they asked. "Is this the one you say was born blind? How is it that now he can see?" ²⁰ "**We know he is our son**," the parents answered, "and **we know he was born blind**. ²¹ But **HOW he can see** now, or **WHO opened his eyes**, we don't know. **Ask him. He is of age**; he will speak for himself." ²² His parents said this because **they were afraid** of the Jews, for already the Jews had decided that anyone who acknowledged that Jesus was the Christ would be put out of the synagogue. ²³ That was why his parents said, "He is of age; ask him."

Luke 6:22 (NIV) Blessed are you when people HATE you and when they <u>EXCLUDE you</u> and **REVILE you** and **SPURN** your name as evil, on ACCOUNT of the Son of Man.

Once I Was BLIND but Now I SEE ~ John 9:24-34

➔ The Pharisees Question the Blind Man a SECOND Time

²⁴ A second time they summoned the man who had been blind. "<u>Give glory to God</u>," they said. "**We know this man is a sinner**." ²⁵ He REPLIED, "Whether he is a sinner or not, **I don't know**. One thing I do know. **I was blind but now I see!**"

One thing I do KNOW - ONCE I was BLIND - but NOW I SEE

²⁶ Then they **asked him**, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" ²⁷ He answered, "I have **told you already** and **you did not listen**. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?" ²⁸ Then they **hurled insults** at him and said, "You are this fellow's disciple! We are disciples of Moses! ²⁹ We know that God spoke to Moses, but as for **this fellow**, **we don't even know where he comes from**."

³⁰ The man answered, "**Now that is remarkable! You don't know where he comes from, yet he opened my eyes**. ³¹ We know that **God does not listen to sinners**. He listens to the godly man who does his will. ³² **Nobody has ever heard** of opening the eyes of a man born blind. ³³ **If this man were not from God, he could DO nothing**." ³⁴ To this they replied, "You were steeped in sin at birth; how dare you lecture us!" And they threw him out.

I Believe in Jesus the Son of Man ~ John 9:35-41

³⁵ Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, and when he found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" ³⁶ "Who is he, sir?" the man asked. "Tell me so that I may believe in him." ³⁷ Jesus said, "You have now seen Him; in fact, He is the one speaking with you." ³⁸ Then the man said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him. ³⁹ Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, so that the blind will SEE and those who see will become blind." ⁴⁰ Some Pharisees who were with him heard him say this and asked, "What? Are we blind too?" ⁴¹ Jesus said, "If you were blind, you would not be guilty of sin; but now that you claim you can see, your guilt remains.

→Jesus asked him to make a Commitment right after he had been Persecuted.

The physical blindness of the man born blond was treatable by the power of God's Son. But the Pharisees, unwilling to acknowledge **their own spiritual blindness**, placed themselves beyond the realm of **His healing power**. HNTC

IMPLICATION

➔ There are None so BLIND as those who WILL NOT see

What Things Do We REFUSE To See?

- That God's Forgiveness and Grace Really APPLY to us
- That God is GOOD during Times of Hardship, Suffering, or Pain
- **1 Thessalonians 5:16-18** Be **joyful** always; ¹⁷ **pray** continually; ¹⁸ give **thanks IN** ALL circumstances, for **this IS God's WILL for you IN Christ Jesus.**

TAKE AWAY ??

2 Corinthians 4:6-7 (ESV) But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to SHOW that the surpassing power belongs to God and NOT to us.

2 Timothy 2:20 (NIV) In a large house there are articles not only of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay; some are for noble purposes and some for <u>ignoble</u>.

My FAITH has founding a Resting Place - not in device nor creed; I trust the ever Living One - His wounds for me shall plead.

Enough for me that Jesus saves - this ends my fear and doubt;
