The CENSUS of the Nation

In that time and culture a man only had the right to count that which actually belonged to him. Israel did NOT belong to David; Israel BELONGED to God.

2 Samuel 24:10-11 (NLT) **Please forgive my guilt**, LORD, for doing this foolish thing." ¹¹ The next morning the **Word of the LORD** came to the prophet Gad, who was David's seer. This was the message:

Lessons From David's Life

- Acknowledge and CONFESSED his sin to God
- Forgiveness does NOT Remove the CONSEQUENCES of sin
- God wants us to fully TRUST Him and to Obey Him
- Reveals that one person can MAKE a DIFFERENCE
- David received REBUKE by humbly admitting his faults
