A Portrait of EVIL ~ 1 Kings 20- 21

→ Scripture Reading - 1 Kings 19, 20, 21

INTRODUCTION

1 Kings 19:12–13 (NLT) ¹² ... And after the fire there was the sound of a Gentle Whisper. ¹³ When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his cloak and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. And a voice said, "What are you doing HERE, Elijah?"

An UN-NAMED Prophet Confronts Ahab ~ 1 Kings 20:1-42

- **1 Kings 20:13** (NLT) Then a <u>certain prophet</u> came to see King Ahab of Israel and told him, "This is what the LORD says: Do you see all these enemy forces? Today I will hand them all over to you. Then you will know that I AM the LORD."
- ²² Afterward the <u>prophet</u> said to King Ahab, "Get ready for another attack. Begin making plans now, for the king of Aram will come back next spring." (NLT)
- ²³ After their DEFEAT, Ben-hadad's officers said to him, "The Israelite gods are gods of the hills; that is why they won. But we can beat them easily on the plains. (NLT)
- **1 Kings 20:26–27** (NLT) ²⁶ The following spring he called up the Aramean army and marched out against Israel, this time at Aphek. ²⁷ Israel then mustered its army, set up supply lines, and marched out for battle. But the Israelite army looked like two little flocks of goats in comparison to the vast Aramean forces that filled the countryside!
- Then the man of God went to the king of Israel and said, "This is what the LORD says: The Arameans have said, 'The LORD is a god of the hills and not of the plains.' So I will defeat this vast army for you. Then you will KNOW that I am the LORD. (NLT)

IMPLICATION

Hebrews 11:36-39 (NIV) ³⁶ Some faced jeers and flogging, while still others were chained and put in prison. ³⁷ They were stoned; they were sawed in two; they were put to death by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated - ³⁸ the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground. ³⁹ These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised.

Hebrews 6:10 (NLT) For God is not unjust. He will not forget how hard you have worked for Him and how you have shown your love to HIM by caring for other believers, as you still do.

So send I you to labor unrewarded, To serve unpaid, unloved, unsought, unknown,

To bear rebuke, to suffer scorn and scoffing So send I you, to toil for Me alone.

¹⁵ Then the LORD told him, "Go BACK the same way you came... (NLT)

¹⁸ Yet I will preserve 7,000 others in Israel who have NEVER bowed down to Baal... (NLT)

¹ Now there was a man named Naboth, from Jezreel, who owned a vineyard in Jezreel beside the palace of King Ahab of Samaria. ² One day Ahab said to Naboth, "Since your vineyard is so convenient to my palace, I would like to buy it to use as a vegetable garden. I will give you a better vineyard in exchange, or if you prefer, I will pay you for it." ³ But Naboth replied, "The LORD forbid that I should give you the inheritance that was passed down by my ancestors."

⁴ So Ahab went home angry and sullen because of Naboth's answer. The king went to bed with his face to the wall and refused to eat! ⁵ "What's the matter?" his wife Jezebel asked him. "What's made you so upset that you're not eating?" ⁶ "I asked Naboth to sell me his vineyard or trade it, but he refused!" Ahab told her. ⁷ "Are you the king of Israel or not?" Jezebel demanded. "Get up and eat something, and don't worry about it. I'll get you Naboth's vineyard!" (NLT)

¹¹ So the elders and other town leaders followed the <u>instructions Jezebel</u> had written in the letters. ¹² They called for a fast and put Naboth at a prominent place before the people. ¹³ Then the two scoundrels came and sat down across from him. And they accused Naboth before all the people, saying, He cursed God and the king. So he was dragged outside the town and stoned to death. (NLT)

To make Seizure of the Vineyard LEGAL...

- Corrupt Judges made FALSE accusations
- Naboth had to DIE
- His sons also had to DIE

²⁰ "So, my enemy, you have found me!" Ahab exclaimed to Elijah. "Yes," Elijah answered, "I have come because you have sold yourself to what is evil in the Lord's sight. ²¹ So now the Lord says, 'I will bring disaster on you and consume you. I will DESTROY every one of your male descendants, slave and free alike, anywhere in Israel! ²² I am going to DESTROY your family as I did the family of Jeroboam... and the family of Baasha..., for you have made me very angry and have led Israel into sin.' ²³ "And regarding Jezebel, the Lord says, 'Dogs will eat Jezebel's body at the plot of land in Jezreel.' ²⁴ "The members of Ahab's family who die in the city will be eaten by dogs, and those who die in the field will be eaten by vultures." ²⁵ (No one else so completely <u>sold himself</u> to what was EVIL in the Lord's sight as Ahab did under the influence of his wife Jezebel. ²⁶ His worst outrage was worshiping idols just as the Amorites had done - the people whom the LORD had driven out from the land ahead of the Israelites.) (NLT)

An innocent man and his sons lay dead; a Evil king and queen had made a mockery of justice; responsible citizens had engaged in this great Evil. And God had not intervened to prevent this from taking place. EVIL appeared to have won to have spoken the last word. But although God's judgment is NOT always IMMEDIATE, it is ALWAYS CERTAIN. HOTC

^{21:27} But when Ahab heard this message, he tore his clothing, dressed in burlap, and fasted. He even slept in burlap and went about in deep mourning. 28 Then another message from the LORD came to Elijah: 29 "Do you see how Ahab has humbled himself before me? Because he has done this, I will not do what I promised during his lifetime. It will happen to his sons; I will destroy his dynasty." (NLT)
