

**2 Kings 2:8-9 13-15 (NLT)**

<sup>8</sup> Then Elijah folded his cloak together and struck the water with it. The river divided, and the two of them went across on dry ground!

<sup>9</sup> ...Elijah said to Elisha, “Tell me what I can do for you before I am taken away.” And Elisha replied, “Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit and become your successor.”

<sup>13</sup> Elisha picked up Elijah's cloak, which had fallen when he was taken up. Then Elisha returned to the bank of the Jordan River.

<sup>14</sup> He struck the water with Elijah's cloak and cried out, "Where is the LORD, the God of Elijah?" Then the river divided, and Elisha went across.

<sup>15</sup> When the group of prophets from Jericho saw from a distance what happened, they exclaimed, “Elijah’s spirit rests upon Elisha!” And they went to meet him and bowed to the ground before him.

**Elijah- My God IS YAHWEH 875 - 850 BC**

**Elisha- My God IS SALVATION 850- 800 BC**

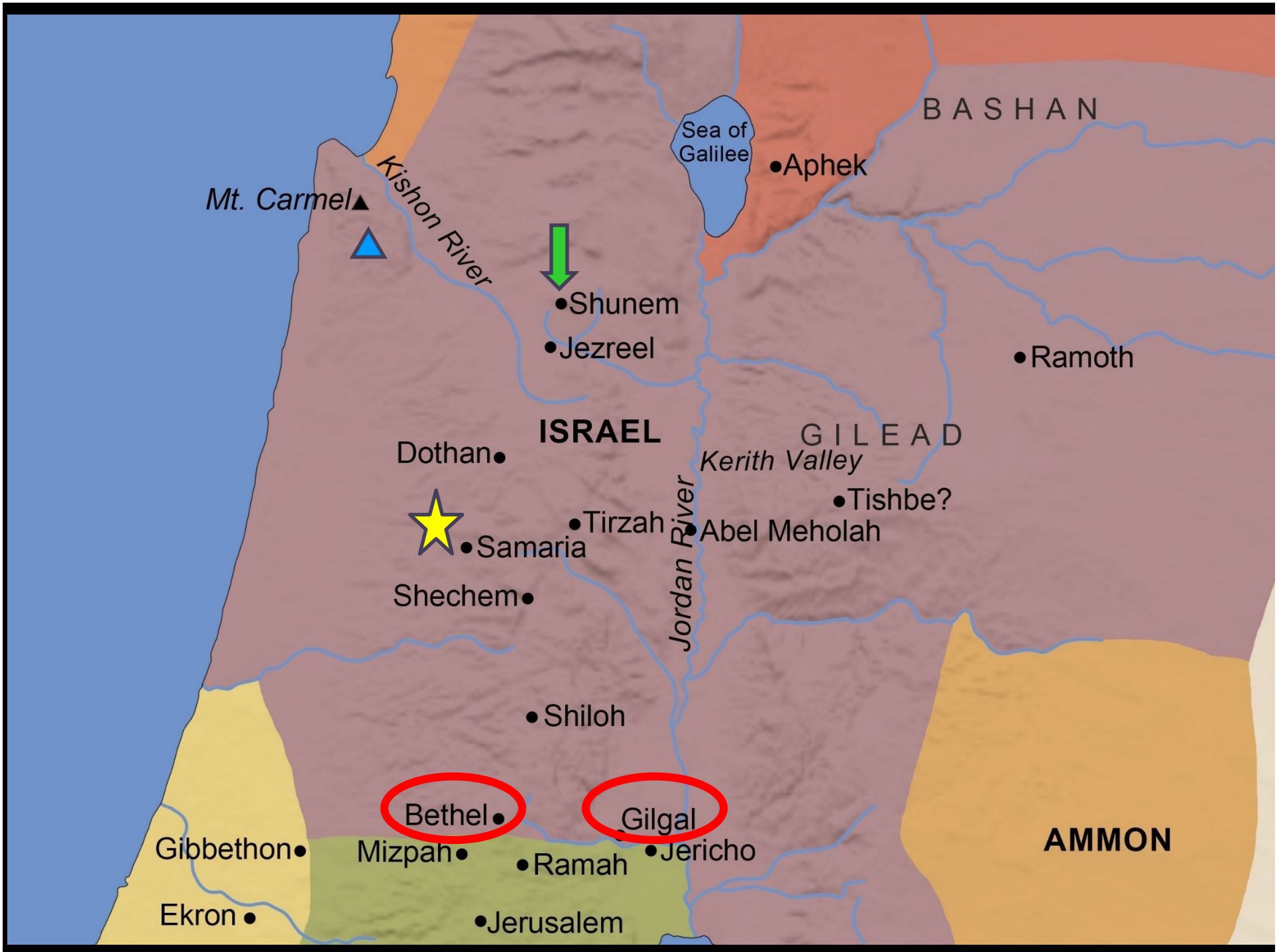
<sup>1</sup> But Moses protested again, “**What if** they won’t believe me or listen to me? **What if** they say, ‘The LORD never appeared to you?’”
