#### 2 Kings 18:1–7 (NLT)

<sup>1</sup> Hezekiah son of Ahaz began to rule over Judah in the third year of King Hoshea's reign in Israel. <sup>2</sup> He was twenty-five years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem twenty-nine years...

...<sup>3</sup> He did what was pleasing in the LORD's sight, just as his ancestor David had done.

<sup>4</sup> He removed the pagan shrines, smashed the sacred pillars, and cut down the Asherah poles. He broke up the bronze serpent that Moses had made, because the people of Israel had been offering sacrifices to it...

<sup>5</sup> Hezekiah trusted in the LORD, the God of Israel. There was no one like him among all the kings of Judah, either before or after his time.

<sup>6</sup> He remained faithful to the LORD in everything, and he carefully obeyed all the commands the LORD had given Moses.

<sup>7</sup> So the LORD was with him, and Hezekiah was successful in everything he did. He revolted against the king of Assyria and refused to pay him tribute.



 <sup>19</sup> The LORD had humbled Judah because of Ahaz king of Israel, for he had promoted wickedness in Judah and had been most unfaithful to the LORD.

<sup>22</sup> In his time of trouble King Ahaz became even more unfaithful to the LORD. <sup>23</sup> He offered sacrifices to the gods of Damascus, who had defeated him;

for he thought, Since the gods of the kings of Aram have helped them, I will sacrifice to them so they will help me...

<sup>24</sup> Ahaz gathered together the furnishings from the temple of God and took them away. He SHUT the DOORS of the LORD's temple and SET UP altars at every street corner in Jerusalem. <sup>25</sup> In every town in Judah he built high places to burn sacrifices to other gods...

<sup>29:23</sup> Then they brought the goats for the sin offering right into the presence of the king and the congregation, who laid their hands on them.

<sup>24</sup> The priests slaughtered the goats and put their blood on the altar for a SIN Offering, to make Atonement for ALL Israel, for the king said that the burnt offering and sin offering were for all Israel.

Hebrews 10:11–12 (NIV) **Day after day** every priest **stands** and performs **his religious duties**; **again and again** he offers the **same sacrifices**, which can **NEVER take away sins**.

<sup>12</sup> But when THIS Priest had offered

<sup>18</sup>...May the LORD, who is GOOD, pardon everyone <sup>19</sup> who sets his heart on Seeking God - the LORD, the God of his fathers - even if he is not clean according to the rules of the sanctuary

<sup>23</sup> Am I ONLY a God nearby, declares the Lord, and NOT a God far away?
