#### Ezra 9:4-10 (NIV)

<sup>4</sup> Then everyone who trembled at the words of the God of Israel gathered around me because of this unfaithfulness of the exiles. And I sat there appalled until the evening sacrifice.

<sup>5</sup> Then, at the evening sacrifice, I rose from my self-abasement, with my tunic and cloak torn, and fell on my knees with my hands spread out to the LORD my God

<sup>6</sup> and prayed: "O my God, I am too ashamed and disgraced to lift up my face to You my God, because our sins are higher than our heads and our guilt has reached to the heavens.

<sup>7</sup> From the days of our forefathers until now, our guilt has been great. Because of our sins, we and our kings and our priests have been subjected to the sword and captivity, to pillage and humiliation at the hand of foreign kings, as it is today.

<sup>8</sup> "But now, for a brief moment, the LORD our God has been gracious in leaving us a remnant and giving us a firm place in his sanctuary, and so our God gives light to our eyes and a little relief in our bondage.

<sup>9</sup> Though we are slaves, our God has not deserted us in our bondage. He has shown us kindness in the sight of the kings of Persia: He has granted us new life to rebuild the house of our God and repair its ruins, and he has given us a wall of protection in Judah and Jerusalem.

# **Dealing DECISIVELY** with Sin

#### Ezra 9:1-10:44

## <sup>4</sup> Then everyone who **TREMBLED** at the Words of the God...

Psalm 119:9–11 (NIV) How can a **young man** keep his way **pure**? By living according to Your Word. <sup>10</sup> I seek You with ALL my heart; do NOT let me stray from Your commands. <sup>11</sup> I have hidden Your Word in my heart that I might NOT sin against You.

How can I be Pure in my Walk with God?
> OBEY God's Word
> SEEK God with ALL my Heart
> ASK God for help
> HIDE His Word in my heart

Psalm 119:14–16 (NIV) I Rejoice in following Your statutes as one rejoices in great riches. <sup>15</sup> I Meditate on Your precepts and consider Your ways. <sup>16</sup> I Delight in Your decrees; I will not Neglect Your Word.

Never NEGLECT God's Word

Psalm 106:34–39 (NIV) They did not destroy the peoples as the LORD had commanded them, <sup>35</sup> but they mingled with the nations and adopted their customs. <sup>36</sup> They worshiped their idols, which became a snare to them.

<sup>37</sup> They sacrificed their sons and their daughters to demons. <sup>38</sup> They shed innocent blood, the blood of their sons and daughters, whom they sacrificed to the idols of Canaan, and the land was desecrated by their blood.

<sup>39</sup> They **DEFILED** themselves by what they did; **by their deeds they prostituted themselves**.

#### **Remember that Ezra 9-10**

is DESCRIPTIVE - telling us what happened
 not PRESCRIPTIVE - telling us what to do today

2 Corinthians 6:14–15 (NIV) Do NOT be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness? <sup>15</sup> What fellowship can light have with and Belial? What does a believer have in common with an unbeliever?

Do not form any relationship, whether temporary or permanent, with unbelievers that would lead to a compromise of Christian standards or jeopardize consistency of Christian witness. Expositors

Hosea 6:6 (NET) For I Delight in faithfulness, not simply in sacrifice; I Delight in acknowledging God, not simply in whole burnt offerings.

Micah 6:8 (NIV) He has showed you, O man, what is GOOD. And what does the LORD Require of you? To act Justly and to love Mercy and to walk Humbly with your God.
